AOCS' satisfaction rating has increased by nine percentage points since 2017.

While we are proud of what has been accomplished under these trying circumstances, I can promise you we are not done yet! We will continue to innovate to make sure we are creating value for our members. In the end, however, we are only as strong as our members who volunteer their time and passion to advance science and technology. I encourage you to help strength our community by staying actively engaged and volunteering your time and expertise.
